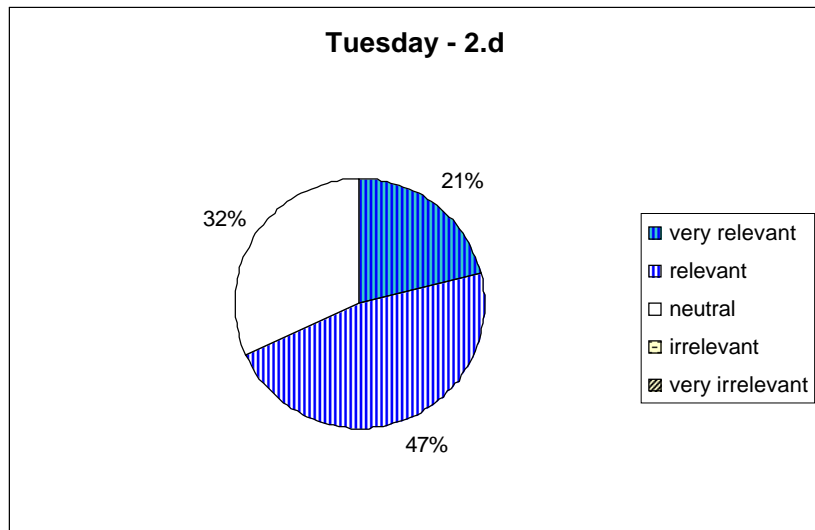
b- The progress of and opportunities for partnership with civil society (Anna Senga)



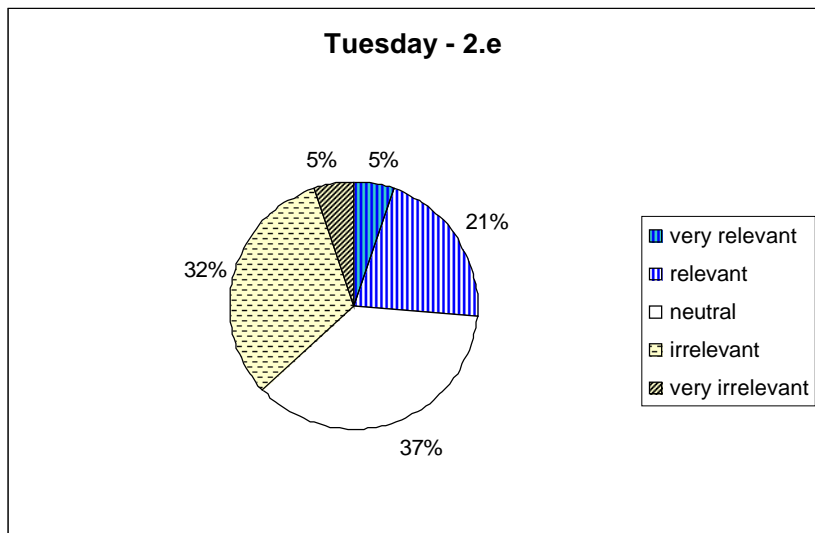

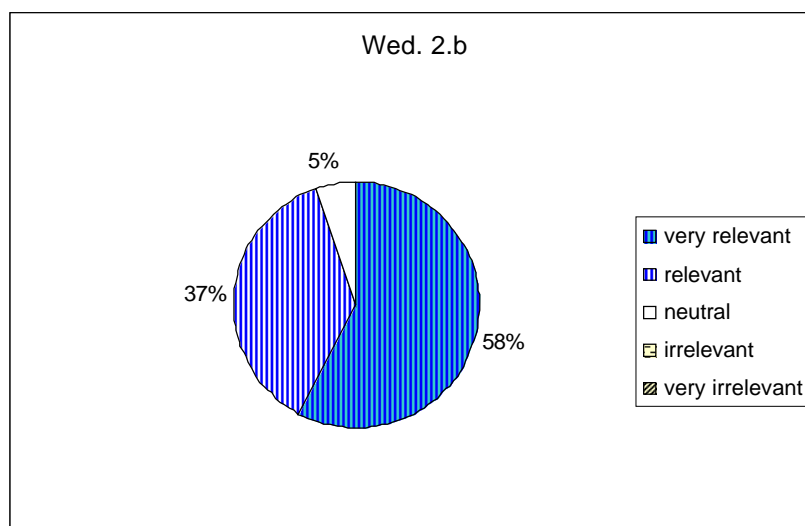


2- To which extent were the presentations / sessions relevant?

a- Global Compact overview (Casper)



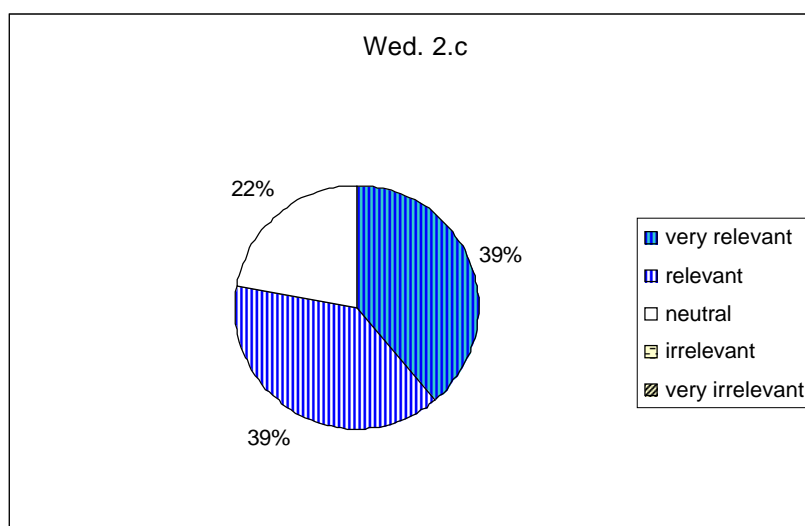
b- GC Country examples (K. Borchgrevink, G. Delalande)

- Very good initiative to include JPOs' experience.

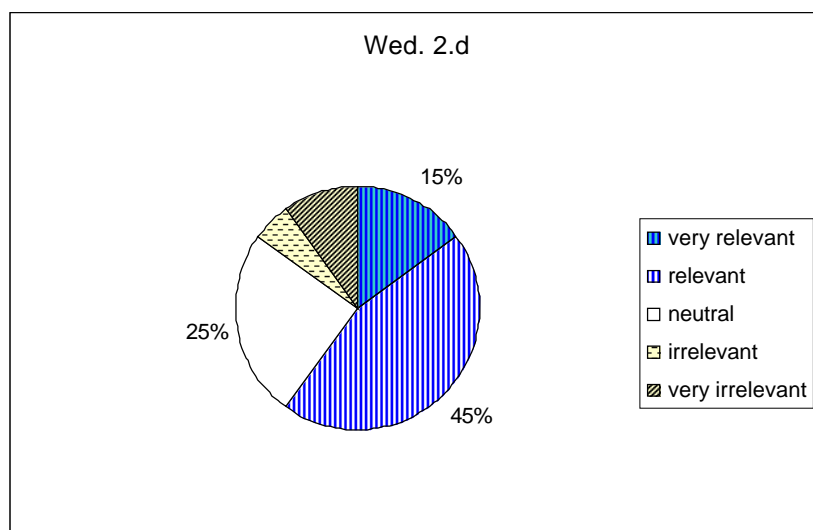
f- Commission on the Private Sector and Development: Unleashing Entrepreneurship - Making Business Work for The Poor (Casper)

- Too little discussion.

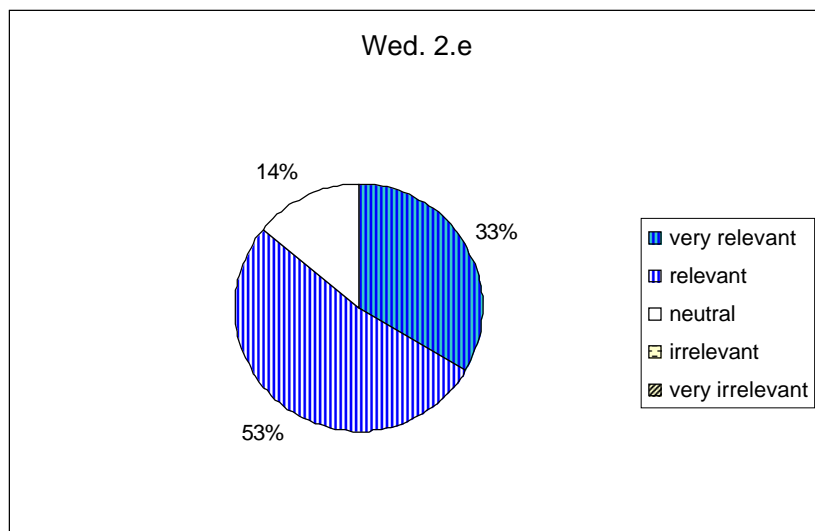
g- Case study: Building supply and distribution chains with local SMEs - Unilever Vietnam (Tran Vu Hoiai)



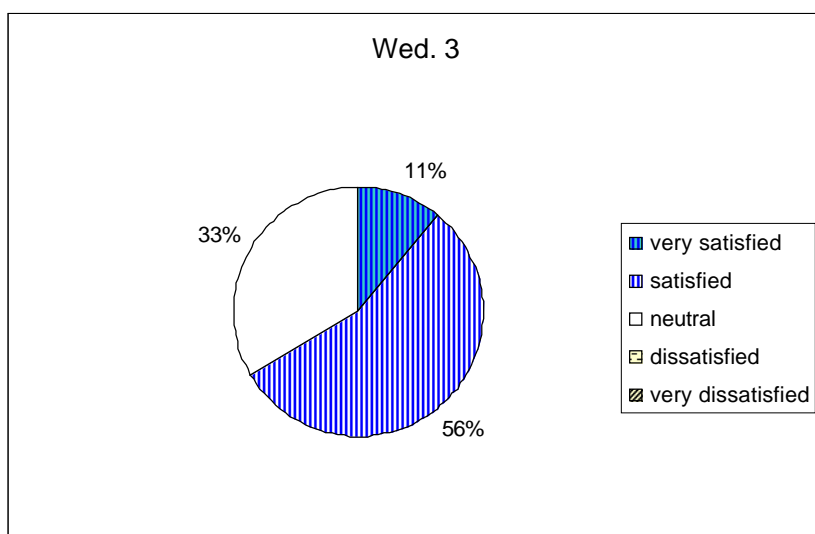
Comments:

- It would have been nice to see how UNDP could have been involved, may be in a group discussion?
- Relevant but too long. Anything about the problems?
- This presentation was very useful -also unconsciously- to understand the difference of mentality between the private sector and "us". The content was not useful: more of shareholder's presentation rather than an interesting view on private sector's approach to possible partnership.
- Very good although not applicable to a number of countries represented here, as it was the case with the BP presentation. Cases applicable to LDCs should have been here.

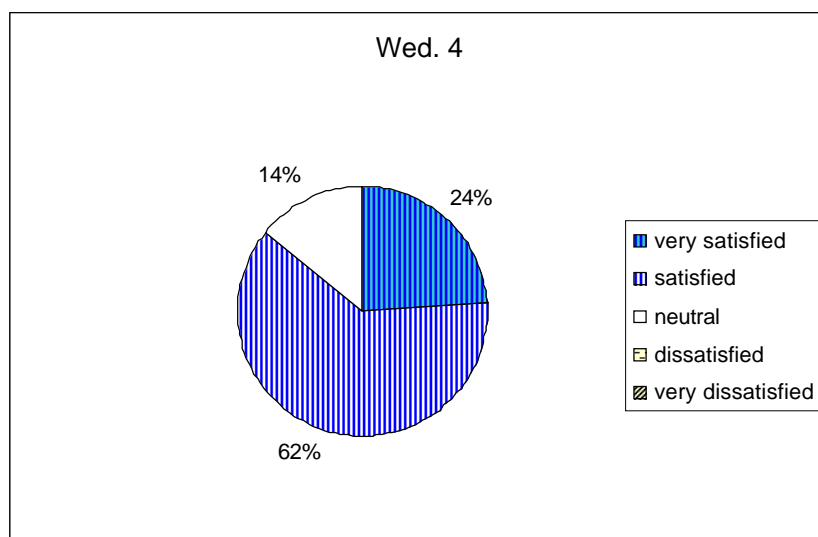
3- How would you assess the Working Group sessions so far?

4- How would you assess the facilitation of the workshop?

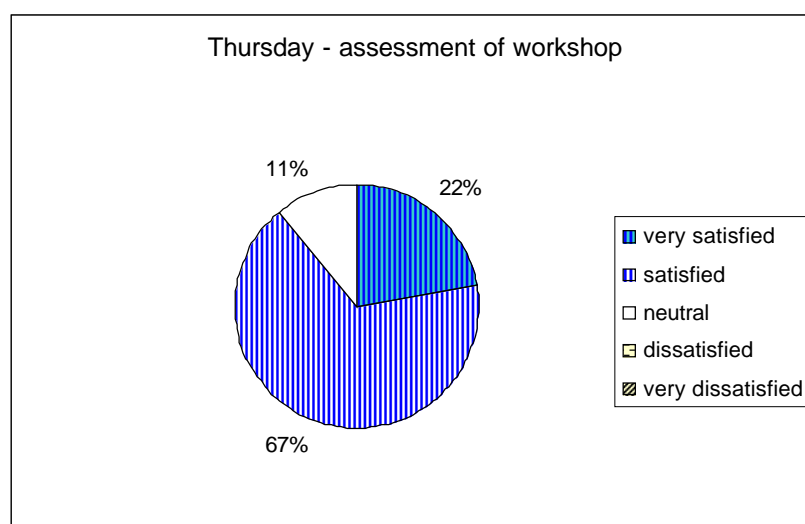


Comments:

- Lunch period is pretty tricky: not enough time.

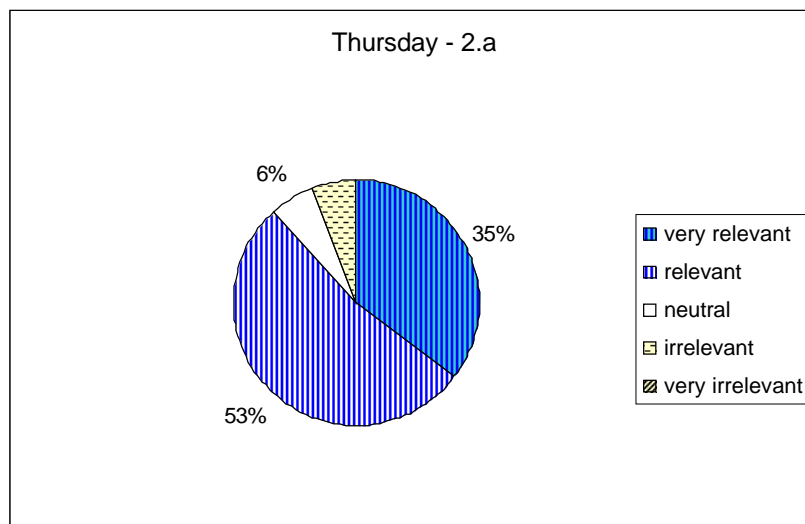

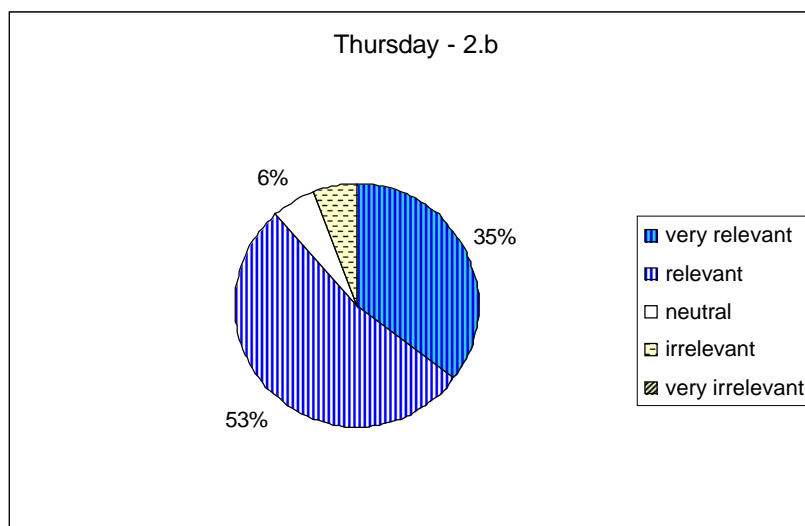
a- Bat Trang Village



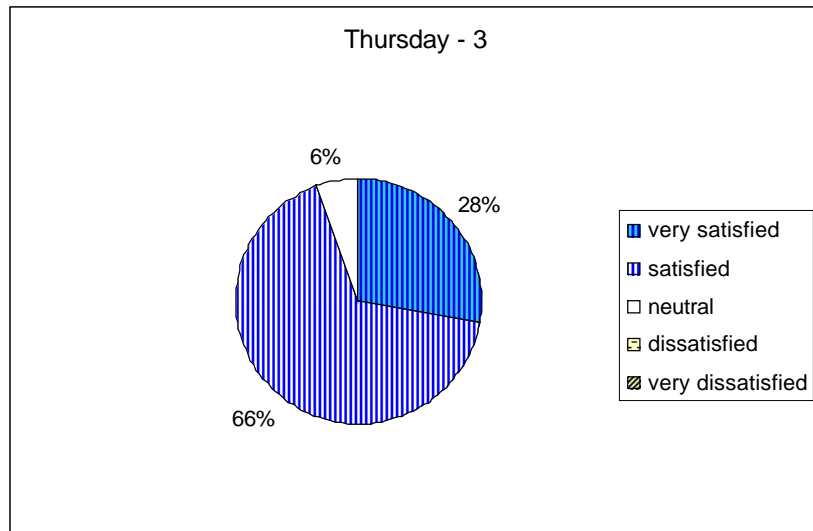
Comments:

- Given the climate, the itinerary was a bit too full, though very interesting. May be it would help to divide the field visit in 2 days.

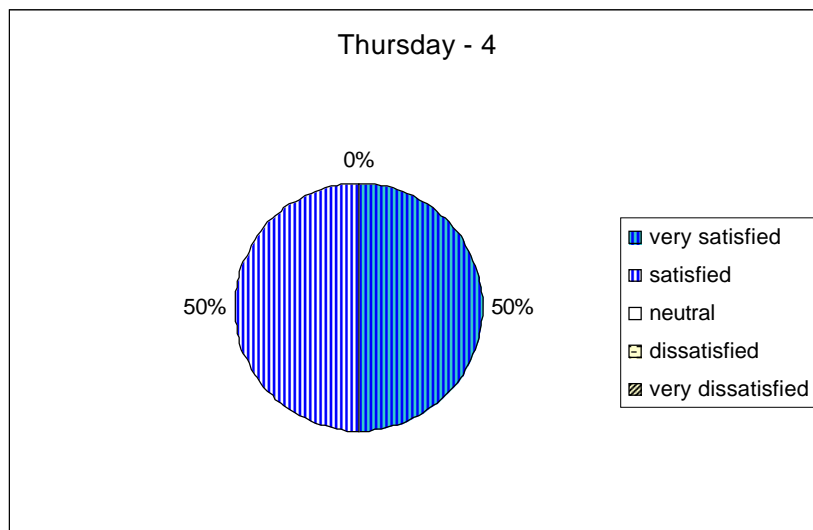
b- Hai Duong kiln

- A very relevant and interesting workshop. Civil society component was fully integrated in the programme. Design the agenda based on input and demand from JPOs, as it was done for the private sector component.
- The role of the HRAs was not clear: what is the added value of having 4 staff of the JPOSC present here? Excellent job done by Casper and Soren.
- I think it would be very nice if we could adhere to time schedule, particularly beginning of sessions (morning and after breaks)
- Brief presentation of the role of UNDP [*to the resource people*] would have helped.
- Expectations raised at the beginning of the workshop were mostly met, and overall the objectives were achieved. The specific case studies and inputs from other JPOs in implementing the recommendations and strategy set out in the various reports to promote public/private partnership and SME development were very constructive and helpful.
